GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF TASK(S) AND OBJECTIVES TO BE ACHIEVED

This position is to provide technical support to the Chair of the CGIAR <u>Standing Panel on Impact Assessment</u> (Professor Karen Macours) as she fulfills her duties in that capacity. In particular, the tasks are to be focused on the following activities:

- Provide scientific and technical analysis in support of the planning, implementation and monitoring of the SPIA workplan
- Provide general research support to Prof. Macours, including data collection and analysis; preparation of presentation materials; support with manuscript preparation; etc.
